The starting date is 1 October 2022.

Profile of the position

The successful candidate is part of the research team of the PI Prof. Dr. Alexander H. Trechsel, together with another postdoctoral researcher. The position concerns the co-coordination and implementation of the big data and text analysis (parliamentary debates and roll-call votes) work package; and development and implementation of the VAA (with a technical partner). The candidate will work closely together with the other postdoctoral researcher, and co-author publications with the project team. This is a research position that does not include obligatory teaching.

Requirements:

- A PhD in Political Science or a closely related field, with preference for the subfields of Political Behaviour or Political Communication. The PhD should be completed.
- Strong skills in quantitative methods, with a specialization in quantitative text analysis.
- Strong interest in and ability for excellent academic research, proven through e.g. internationally visible publications, presentations at international conferences, and related research activities.
- Research interest in the political consequences of digitalization (esp. demand side).
- Dedication and ability to work in a team, and ability to work independently.
- Strong English writing and communication skills; command of German.

- Possibility to take up additional teaching (upon later agreement, from 2023)
